### CONGRATULATIONS MAYOR DWIGHT WELCH AND THE COUNTRY CLUB HILLS VILLAGE BOARD

In an effort to increase fire safety and protect its citizens, the Village of Country Club Hills, working closely with the Country Club Hills Fire Department, upgraded its fire codes by passing a "zero tolerance" fire sprinkler ordinance.

The ordinance requires all new commercial buildings, regardless of size, to be protected with a fire sprinkler system. This ordinance also requires apartment-to-condo conversions and large nightclubs with occupancy loads of 200 people or more to be retrofitted with fire sprinkler systems. In addition, all new construction single-family homes, manufactured homes, and those with additions of 50% or more of the original square footage will require fire sprinkler protection following the NFPA 13D standard.

As a result, Country Club Hills will become a truly fire safe community protecting those people who live, work and visit. It also helps safeguard the firefighters who respond to emergency incidents.
